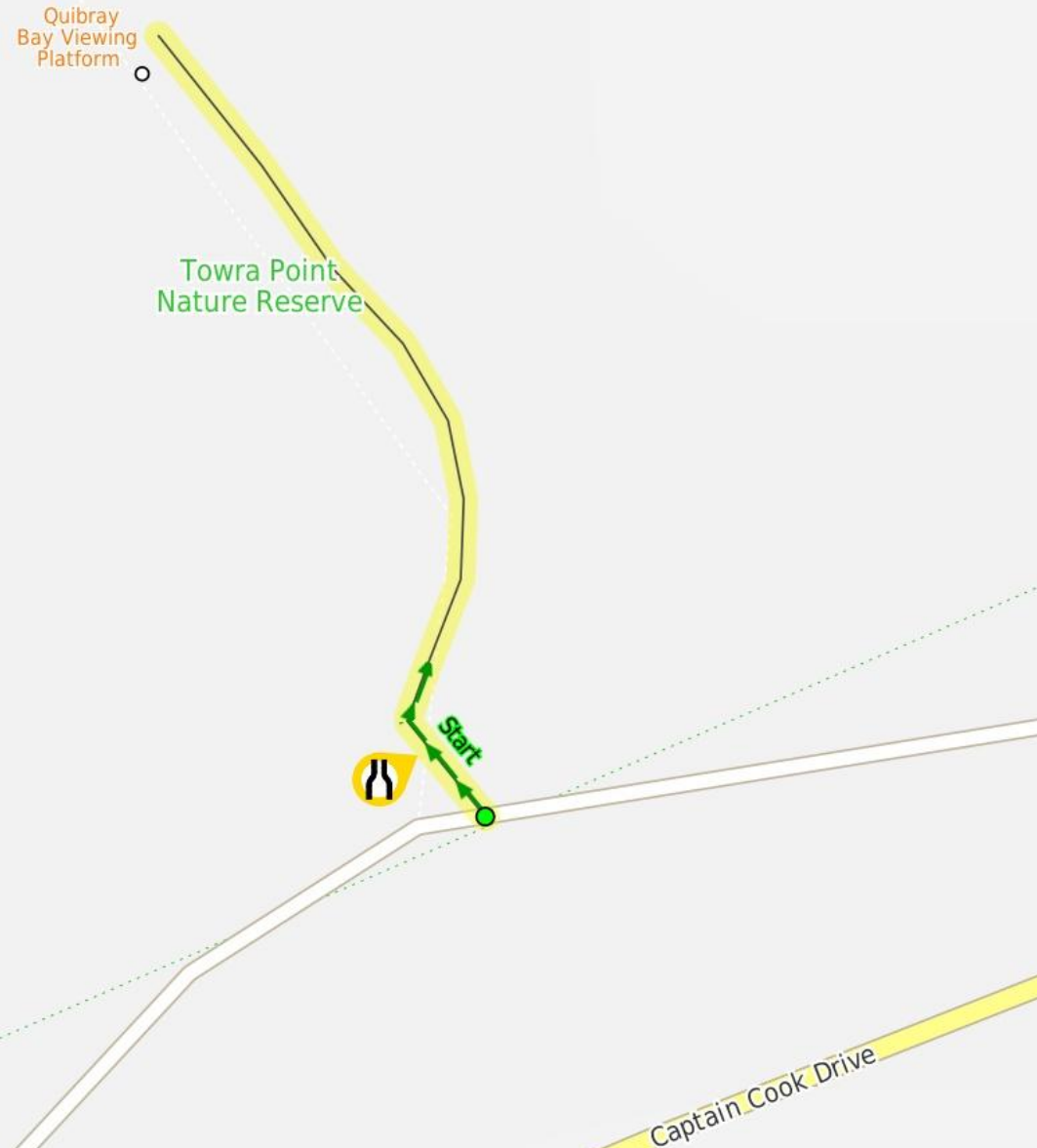


Quibray Bay viewing platform

This short and easy walk to the Quibray Bay viewing/lookout platform provides some lovely views and opportunities for bird watching. The platforms give you views across the heart of the very special Towra Point Nature Reserve. The nature reserve is very close to Sydney and most of it is closed to the public to protect the very fragile ecosystems and the resting area for migratory birds. This walk gives views that most Sydneysiders never see.

0 | Captain Cook Dr

(40 m 1 mins) From the large gravel parking area beside Captin Cook Drive, Kurnell, this walk follows the footpath, between the timber bollards (1.3m gap) to follow the large 'Towra Point Nature Reserve - Quibray Bay Viewing Platform' sign along the concrete path. The walk follows the mostly flat concrete path for about 20m to then follow the timber boardwalk (with handrails) for another 20m to the viewing platform.

0.04 | Quibray Bay Viewing Platform

The Quibray Bay lookout platform is in the heart of the very special Towra Point Nature Reserve, Kurnell. There are magnificent views of the fragile coastline and wetlands. The nature reserve, very close to Sydney is protecting some very fragile ecosystems and is important resting area for migratory birds. The lookout is nestled in a native acacia and banksia forest with open views across the wetlands making it a perfect spot for bird watching. The platform is fenced (1m high), there are no seats but there are information signs about the local flora and fauna. Please stay on the marked tracks.

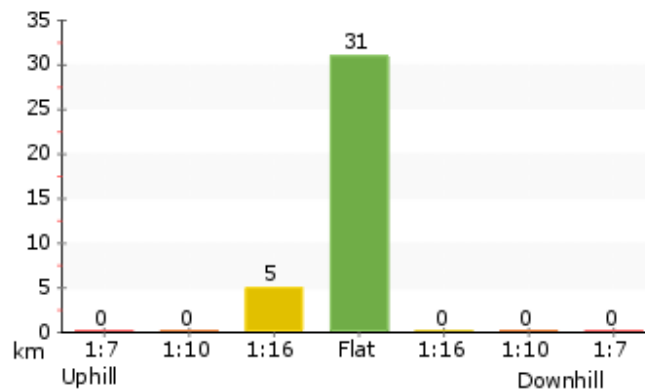
Surface

This walk follows a 1m wide hard concrete path and a timber boardwalk. The parking area can become boggy after rain.

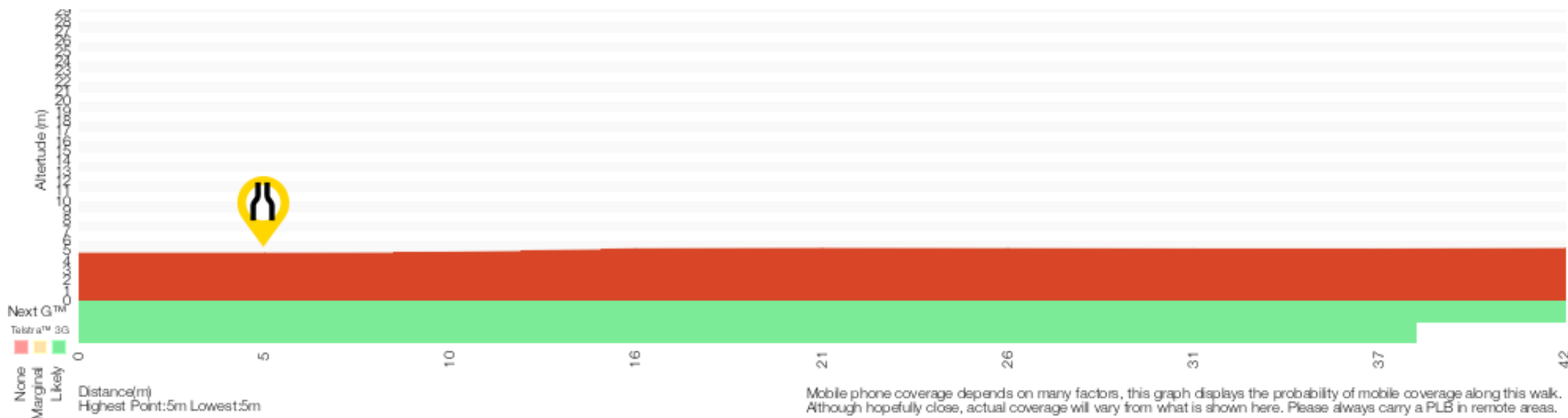
Stepness

1 Pinch Point (10m)

Timber bollard pinchpoints around edge of carpark. The gap between the bollard are 1.3m, 78cm high.
